This funding will be used to

- Increase the percentage of Year Three and Year Five students in NAPLAN upper two bands (U2B) to 50% or above in reading and numeracy in 2022
- Increase the percentage of Year Three and Year Five students achieving NAPLAN national minimum standard (NMS) to 100% in reading and numeracy in 2022
- Increase the percentage of students achieving the current reading benchmarks to 100% in 2022
- Ensure that all students achieve at least one years' reading growth for one years' schooling as measured by NAPLAN Relative Gain
- Ensure 100% of students from Year 3 to Year 6 are using a variety of the ten problem solving strategies

Our initiatives include

- Employing a staff member to work with students across Prep to Year 6, using the Literacy and Numeracy Continuum, to support and plan targeted learning experiences for individuals and small groups
- Development of a whole school approach to the teaching of reading
- Providing targeted professional development and coaching to deepen staff understanding of the Australian Curriculum: reading, in particular how to provide targeted and scaffolded instruction to enable highly effective teaching of reading in every classroom
